"small change that changes lives"



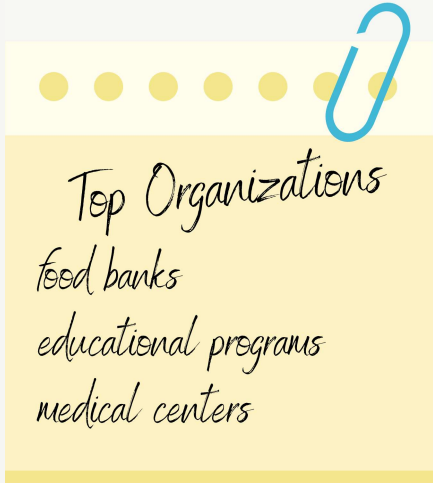
Snapping Shoals EMC members who participate in Operation Round Up are part of a program that has helped thousands of people in our local communities.

Operation Round Up offers a way for members for help neighbors in need for what generally amounts to small change - whatever it takes to round up their power bill to the next dollar. Contributions range from a penny to 99 cents per month, an average of just \$6 a year. As a Round Up participant, your Snapping Shoals bill is simply rounded up to the next full dollar. For example, a bill for \$87.80 would be rounded up to \$88.00 and that 20 cents would be donated to the Operation Round Up program.

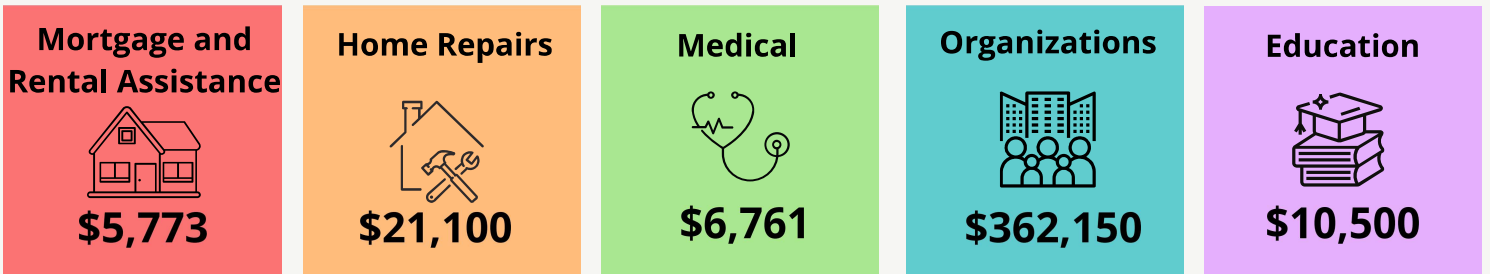
All Operation Round Up requests are reviewed by the Snapping Shoals Electric Trust Board of Directors, which is made up of community leaders who serve on a voluntary basis. The Trust Board meets every other month and evaluates all requests to ensure that funds are disbursed fairly.

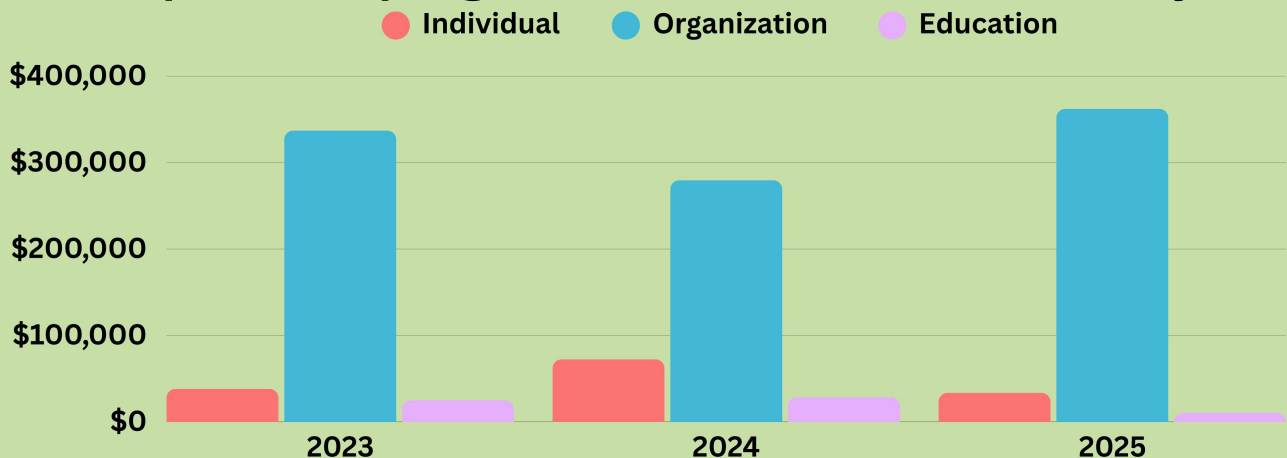
