Our Board of Directors and dedicated and professionally trained employees know that our members are dependent on us for support, so we strive daily to meet these needs. And you should rest assured that no need is too large – not even one created by a pandemic that has affected business as usual since mid-March. BEING THERE for our members means effectively managing costs, so that the rates we charge remain affordable. Our Board of Directors' focus on fiscally conservative practices makes your cooperative one of the most affordable electric utility providers in the state. This is reinforced by the 2020 Georgia Public Service Commission survey of winter rates of all 94 electric providers in Georgia. Your co-op has the lowest residential rates at 2,000 kWh and 1500 kWh and is among the lowest at other levels of the survey, being the 2nd lowest at 1,000 kWh. Our residential rates are the lowest at 2,000 kWh, 1,500 kWh and 1,000 kWh inclusive of Georgia's 41 EMCs and Georgia Power. We take pride in BEING THERE for our members with affordable rates.

In addition to reliable, affordable power, BEING THERE for our members also means being an active community supporter. Snapping Shoals EMC is proud of our involvement in surrounding communities and participation with education, economic development and numerous community and civic organizations. Our Operation Round Up program, Bright Ideas program, various Scholarship awards, and the Washington Youth Tour help numerous individuals, organizations, and students annually. Many Snapping Shoals employees volunteer at area schools, youth organizations and local FFA chapters. Our employees are also actively involved in Newton County's Relay for Life, which benefits the American Cancer Society, and in Blood Drives through the Red Cross.

One of the most important aspects of an electric cooperative is patronage capital. It is unique to the cooperative business model and represents the not-for-profit status under which we operate. Being not-for-profit means that we only collect enough revenue to cover the costs of operating our business. Any excess revenue is retained as patronage capital and when prudent the Board of Directors elects to return a portion of that patronage capital to our members. For 2020, BEING THERE means returning \$4.5 million to our members. This represents the largest patronage capital return ever approved by the Board of Directors. The amount of each qualifying and former members refund was based on their electric energy usage during the years of 2002 and 2019.

Snapping Shoals continues to remain focused on meeting our members' needs and realizes these needs are ever-changing. BEING THERE for our members means we are constantly developing solutions that help to improve the member service experience. Our mySSEMC app provides the ability to pay a bill, report an outage, or to monitor electric usage. We offer several payment options, including MoneyGram, PaySite Kiosks and Vanilla Direct, our newest option which allows payments at Dollar General, CVS, Family Dollar and Speedway. Our outage viewer on our website allows members to monitor outages and our Automatic Transfer Switches help minimize outage areas, as well as outage times. Our marketing partnerships with EMC Security and with Walton Gas, offer important services with other trusted companies. Through these and other services, Snapping Shoals EMC is THERE for our members, bringing value and convenience to the member service experience.

The 11 Snapping Shoals EMC Directors and 236 employees truly consider it an honor and privilege to be able to serve you. The fact that we are owned by those we serve motivates us to work harder every single day, delivering reliable, affordable electricity and services that exceed your expectations. Snapping Shoals EMC is THERE for our members today, tomorrow, and always.



REPORT

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying consolidated financial statements of Snapping Shoals Electric Membership Corporation and Subsidiary (the Corporation), which comprise the consolidated balance sheets as of December 31, 2019 and 2018 and the related consolidated statements of operations, changes in members' equity, and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the consolidated financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these consolidated financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of consolidated financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these consolidated financial statements based on our audits. We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Governmental Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audits to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the consolidated financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the consolidated financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the consolidated financial statements, whether due to

fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Corporation's preparation and fair presentation of the consolidated financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Corporation's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the consolidated financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the consolidated financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Snapping Shoals Electric Membership Corporation and Subsidiary as of December 31, 2019 and 2018 and the results of its operations and cash flows for the years then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Change in Accounting Principle

As discussed in Note 2 to the consolidated financial statements, the Corporation adopted Accounting Standards Update 2014-09, Revenue from Contracts with Customers on January 1, 2019. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.
