Concern for Community is a guiding principle of cooperatives such as Snapping Shoals EMC. In that spirit, SSEMC's Trust Board donated \$141,500 from Operation Round Up funds to food banks in our surrounding communities.

## "small change that changes lives"



Snapping Shoals EMC members who participate in Operation Round Up are part of a program that has helped thousands of people in our local communities.

Operation Round Up offers a way for members for help neighbors in need for what generally amounts to small change - whatever it takes to round up their power bill to the next dollar. Contributions range from a penny to 99 cents per month, an average of just \$6 a year. As a Round Up participant, your Snapping Shoals bill is simply rounded up to the next full dollar. For example, a bill for \$87.80 would be rounded up to \$88.00. and that 20 cents would be donated to the Operation Round Up program.

All Operation Round Up request are reviewed by the Snapping Shoals Electric Trust Board of Directors which is made up of community leaders who serve on a voluntary basis. The Trust Board, which meets every other month, evaluates all requests and works hard to ensure that funds are disbursed fairly.

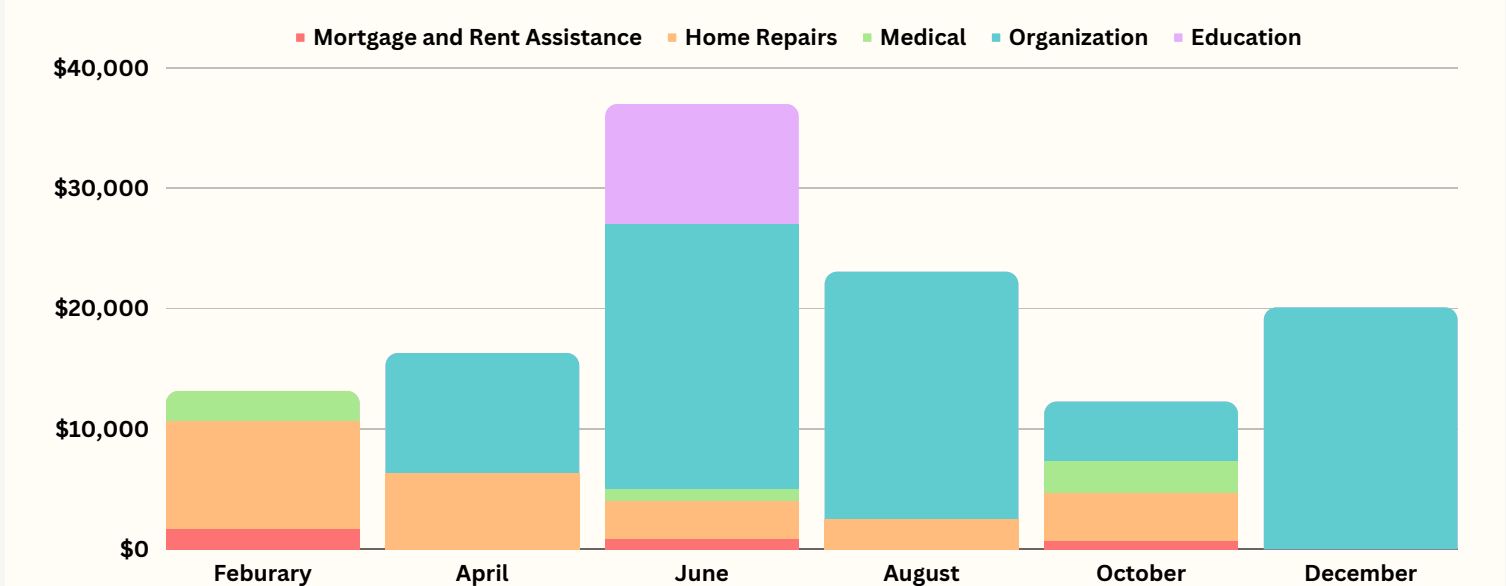

## Alcovy CASA



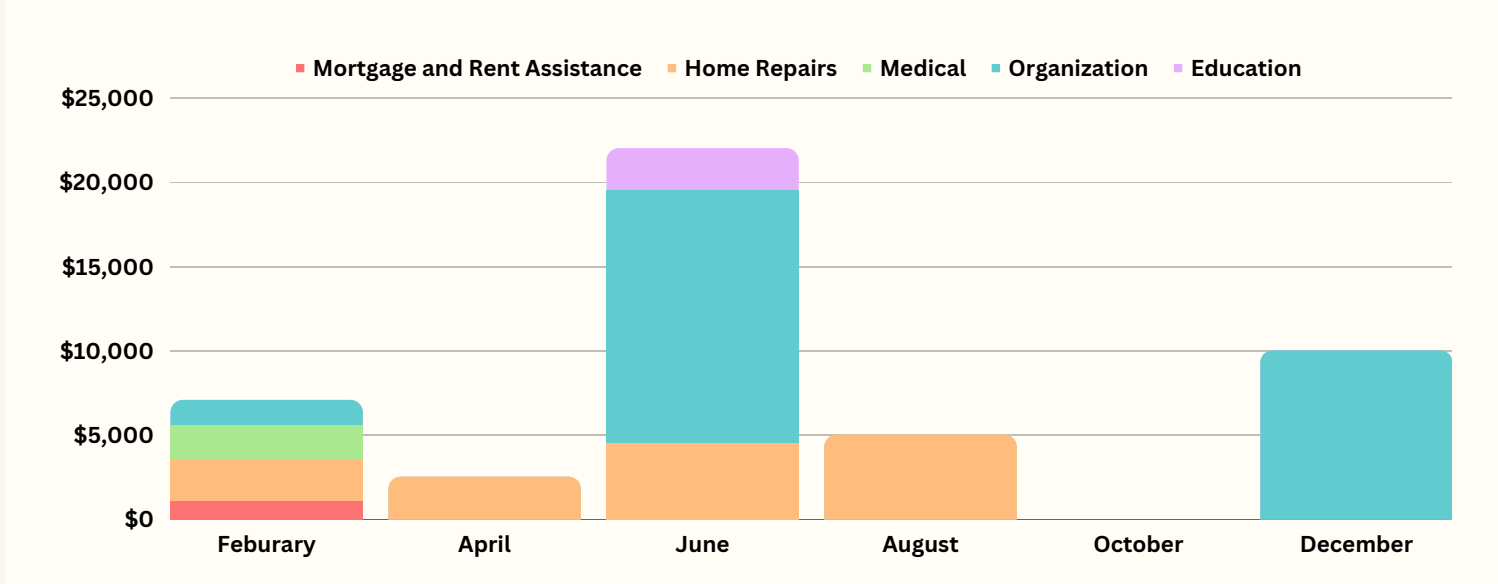

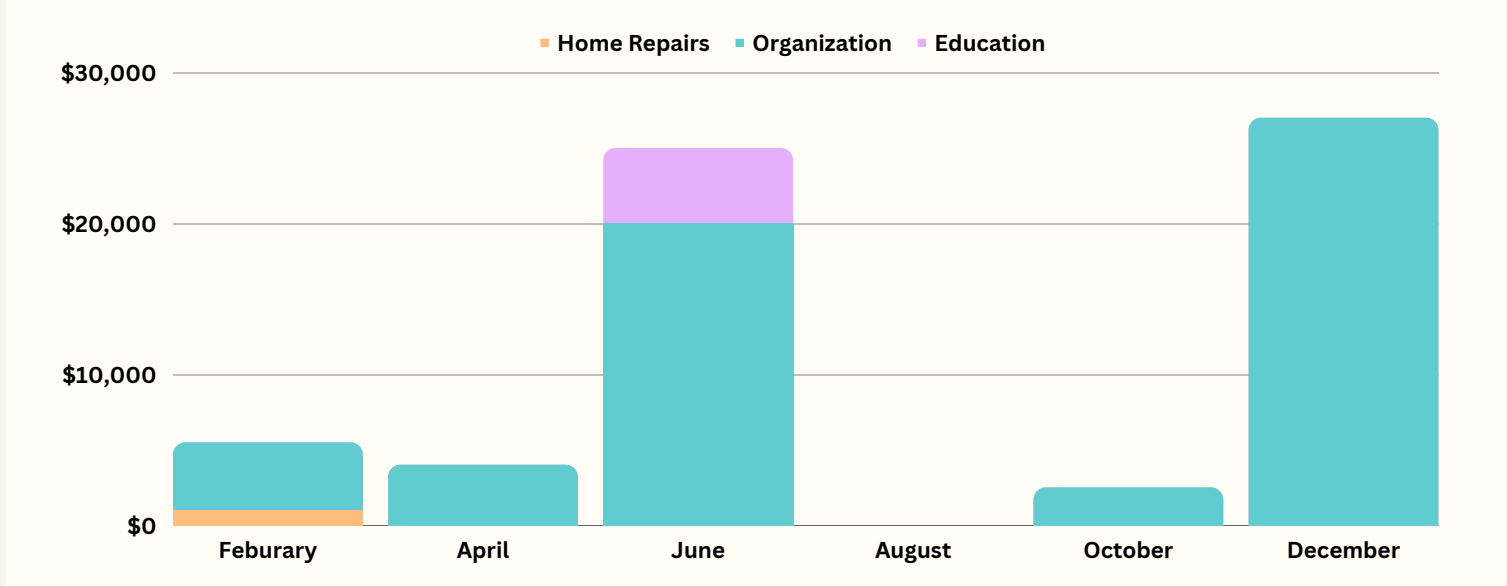
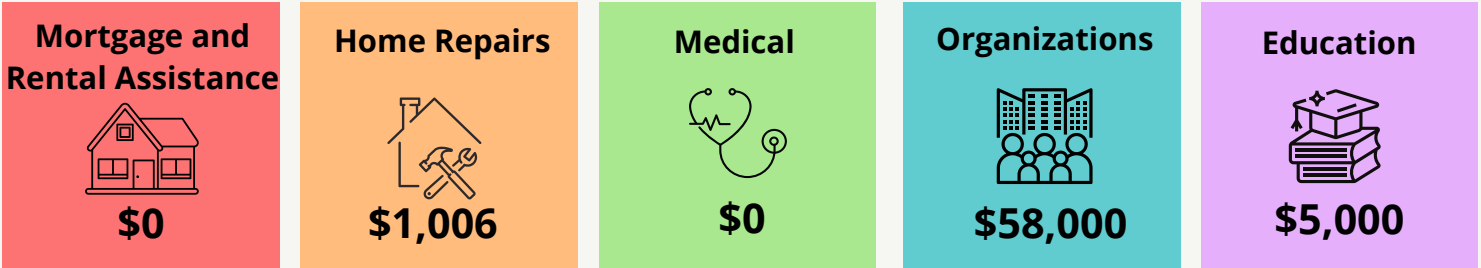


## Rockdale Emergency Relief

## FODAC

Operation Round Up donated \$4,000 to Friends of Disabled Adults (FODAC) and children in April. FODAC's Home Medical Equipment program provides mobility aids and other home medical equipment at little or no cost to children, adults and seniors. The program can have significant impacts on the lives of clients like Presleigh Stringer. Presleigh's family recently visited FODAC for a wheelchair. Presleigh's mother, Cassidy, said getting equipment approved through disability and Medicaid takes "forever," but FODAC was able to immediately get Presleigh the wheelchair she needed. "This will make Presleigh's life so much easier as she attends school, functions and most of all, this prevents her from getting hurt from falls. She's so happy and I am too. This is life-changing," Cassidy Stringer said.

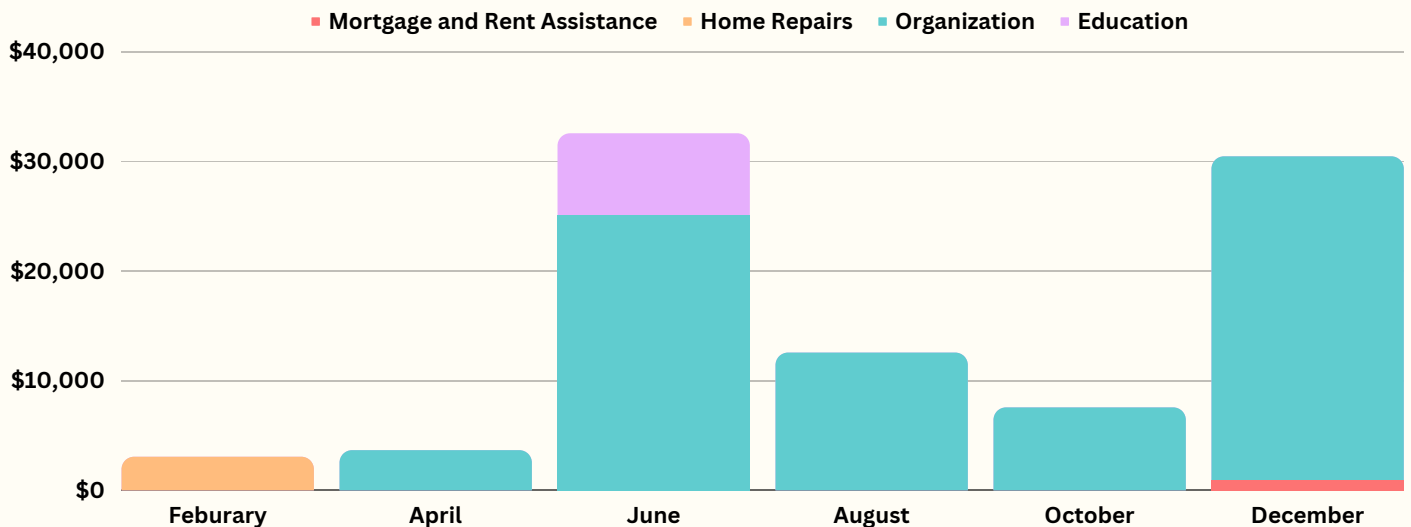
